## Manager of Landfill Operations (MOLO) Training Course

#### **Certification Criteria**

To be eligible for SWANA certification you must successfully complete SWANA 's certification examination, and meet SWANA 's eligibility requirements as determined by completion of a Certification Application.

#### NOT ALL COURSE PARTICIPANTS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR SWANA CERTIFICATION.

If you have any concerns that you may not be eligible for certification (and that is your sole reason for attending), please call us before registering at 1-800-GO-SWANA or send e-mail to <u>certification@swana.org</u>

If you would like to apply for certification as a Certified Landfill Manager, you must complete a Certification Application online at swana.org/training-certification/find-a-course/training-course/manager-of-landfill-operations(molo).

To be eligible for certification as a <u>Certified Landfill Manager</u> an individual must demonstrate that:

- 1. He or she has Direct responsibility for daily operations related to the discipline (For instance, compliance with design and permit conditions, utilization of field equipment and services, personnel management, responses to regulatory agencies, and budgeting.); and
- 2. He or she has at least two years' experience as a landfill manager and a minimum of five years in the MSW management field (may be cumulative) with a High School Degree or GED; or at least two years' experience as a landfill manager and a minimum of four years in the MSW management field (may be cumulative) with a two-year Associates Degree in Civil Engineering, Sanitary Engineering, Environmental Health, Environmental Science, Public Administration, or related or equivalent fields; or at least two years' experience as a landfill management field (may be cumulative) with a two-year sin the MSW preserves and a minimum of three years in the MSW management field (may be cumulative) with a two-year as a landfill manager and a minimum of three years in the MSW management field (may be cumulative) with a four-year Bachelors Degree in any of the above fields.

Certification offered by SWANA is voluntary. SWANA does not endorse or guarantee the quality of any work or conduct of an applicant who has been certified. Coordination and payment for the MOLO exam is handled by the individual. Information will be provided during the course.

Passing a certification exam requires amassing knowledge, skills, and abilities over time from a variety of sources; no one course provides all of the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed to pass a certification exam. Knowledge is gained over time from years of experience in the field; online courses, webinars, and podcasts; in-person seminars and events; hands-on workshops; on-the-job training; local, regional, and national conferences; mentoring programs; trade publications; and more.

#### **Re-Certification Requirements**

Initial certification must be through training and testing provided by SWANA. The term of certification is three years. Re-certification can be accomplished by obtaining 30 Professional Development Hours (PDHs), formerly referred to as CEUs, within the three-year certification term, (re-taking the MOLO training course Tuesday through Thursday will earn the 30 PDHs). There is a \$250 re- certification fee (not included in the cost of the course).
